## Reorganization: What it is and isn't

Our biannual reorganization meeting will take place Wednesday January 14, at 7 PM at the Hall at Fauntleroy. Precinct Committee Officers elected in the August primary will in turn elect these new 34<sup>th</sup> District Democrats officers: Chair, First Vice Chair, Second Vice Chair, State Committeeman, State Committeewoman, King County Committeeman, King County Committeewoman, and King County Committeewoman Alternate.

Elected PCOs and all dues-paying members will elect the Secretary and the Treasurer.

PCOs who were elected as write-ins in the August primary are not eligible to vote, except for Secretary and Treasurer, once their 2009 dues are paid.

This meeting will be convened and conducted under the bylaws of the King County Democratic Central Committee, not those of the 34<sup>th</sup> District Democrats. King County Chair Susan Sheary will administer rules and credentials and will preside until a new 34<sup>th</sup> District Democrats chair is selected, then that person will conduct the meeting.

After the election of District officers, PCOs may be appointed at the discretion of the new District chair, who also can conduct any other District business, under the bylaws of the 34<sup>th</sup> District Democrats.

## So who's running?

For the first time, I am told, since the early 1990s we have a contested election for District chair. Be glad. We have two outstanding candidates, who both would serve the membership and our communities with distinction. Either way, we can't lose.

## Sutherland's Parting Shot at Maury Island

On December 2, departing Land Commissioner Doug Sutherland signed the lease giving Glacier Northwest the missing piece it needed to start building in the fragile aquatic habitat off Maury Island. Practically the next day booms began showing up in the waters surrounding its aging dock off the eastern rim of Maury Island. The old dock must be removed before construction of the 305 foot pier can begin. Glacier officials are planning to work around the clock to get the steel dock in place by January 15 when the fish window, when salmon migrate, closes and they have to postpone work. Coincidentally, this is the day after Peter Goldmark becomes the next Land Commissioner

Doug Sutherland explains, with a straight face, that the \$50,000 he received in September from the Committee for Responsible Stewardship has absolutely nothing to do with his decision. This committee, with a name that belies its actual purpose, is a political action committee formed to support Sutherland's reelection.

Sutherland claims that Glacier's project will improve Maury Island's health because the new dock will replace one that is coated with creosote, a known carcinogen. And under the terms of the lease Glacier will put its shoreline and bluff property into a conservation easement that will protect it from development. Amy Carey of Preserve Islands is not buying it. She says that under current land-use codes neither the bluff nor shoreline are open to development anyway.

Ironically, the lease was approved the day the Partnership for Puget Sound was put into effect. And yet here we are with a plan to put a barge the size of a football field loading gravel and hauling it right into the waters that we are trying to clean up and protect. During the winter orcas feed and calve in this exact area.

Peter Goldmark, Lands Commissioner elect, is disappointed in Sutherland's decision. "While I understand there is only one Lands Commissioner at a time, this decision does come after the voters of Washington sent a very clear message," he said. Besides all the environmental damage there is another consideration: we the citizens of Washington are not getting a very good deal. The lease is grossly undervalued at \$1,500 a year. Another question is who actually owns the mineral rights. This issue had been brought up before the election and has not yet been settled. The state retained the mineral rights when it sold the property around 100 years ago, although Glacier disputes this. Glacier also disputes whether or not gravel is a mineral.

Goldmark is considering suing Glacier in a court of law to establish whether or not the state has ownership of mineral resources. There also will likely be lawsuits filed by environmentally conscious groups concerned about harm to endangered species and other environmental impacts.

As if this weren't enough, Sutherland gave Washington another parting gift: Taylor Farms will be allowed to harvest and sell geoducks the firm planted illegally on state-owned tidelands near Olympia, a gift worth millions.

What can you do? Write a letter to the editor of our local newspapers. Call or e-mail the Governor, the Attorney General, and other officials and let her know how important this is to you. Our legislators are on board already, but cheer them on when you see them.

# Meet the Candidates

The candidates on this and the following page have expressed a willingness to serve in these positions. This does not preclude anyone else from running. Nominations, as always, will be taken from the floor.

## Two Candidates for Chair of the 34th District Democrats.

### Kimber McCreery

During the Obama presidential campaign as your field organizer, we made more than 43,000 calls, knocked on more than 22,000 doors, and registered almost 2000 new voters. This slate represents youth, experience, and diversity—but most of all ability and commitment. It is the product of a lot of talent evaluation and recruitment, which should be every member's job. With these elected officers in these positions, the 34<sup>th</sup> District Democrats will be in great shape.

### And one parting shot

Please ignore the half-truth on the 34<sup>th</sup> District Democrats Web site that says: "After this election, the newly elected Chair of the District will appoint chairs of committees to do the work of the Democratic Party in the 34th."

The District chair MAY appoint committee chairs—or not—according to our bylaws. The Executive Board MAY create standing committees—or not. The new Executive Board MAY adopt new rules—or not.

Aside from the elected officers, the Executive Board has the absolute authority under our bylaws to determine its own size. That is a feature and not a bug. That authority is essential to our well-being and functionality as an organization. It sets the highest bar possible for Executive Board membership, and it establishes the practice that voting positions on the Executive Board should be earned by service, and not handed out like party favors.

No doubt the new chair will appoint several chairs of standing committees that are well known and proven by experience to be essential and functional, such as Finance, Membership, Outreach, Bylaws, Hospitality, Newsletter, and Web site.

Legislative Action could be added to that list, but from several years' experience, including serving as the interim King County LAC chair, it remains to be seen if adding a committee at the District level would be unnecessarily duplicative. We need a District Platform and Resolutions committee about as much as we need an outbreak of anthrax. The county-level committees function quite well.

This represents, in a nutshell, my fundamental difference in approach with members of the "Leadership Development Committee," who apparently think we are better served by packing our Executive Board with chairs of standing committees, before experience has taught us whether even having these committees in the first place is either necessary or desirable.

I wouldn't tolerate it, and neither should you. If people think certain work is necessary or desirable, just go and DO it, like most of us already do. If that work demonstrates its utility to the organization, then—and only then—should it be allowed to rise to the level of a standing committee, with a vote on the Executive Board—and not before.

This is a difference in approach and nothing more. I respect these members' opinions, but I most certainly do not share them, nor is there any reason why I should. There will always be more than one way to skin a cat. As for their notion, expressed elsewhere in this newsletter, that our differences in approach have "driven wedges," "disparaged Democrats," and "divided the organization," there's only one word to describe that.

Silly. It's just plain silly. Laugh at it and let's move ahead. With these final lines of my final chairman's report, I exit laughing.

See you Wednesday, January 14 for "all the democracy you can handle." Remember to laugh.

## District Organizational Issues

Reading the Chair's message in the December newsletter, we are concerned about his portrayal of the Leadership Development Committee and members of the 34th who served on this committee. Over the last year we have been involved in and guided the efforts of this committee. We stand by our efforts for leadership development within the organization, which included drafting executive board rules, and being respectful and inclusive to all that wished to participate. We firmly believe that the committee contributed to the long term vitality of the 34th District Democrats.

Many people in our district organization worked many hours to elect Barack Obama, Chris Gregoire and a large number of other Democratic candidates. Working together as Democrats, we were quite successful. The Chair's message last month not only drives wedges between Democrats, but also disparages Democrats in our own organization for no clear, good reason. While Chairman Ivan Weiss has done some good, productive work in his time as Chairman, his tenure has also been marred by significant strife, distrust and divisions.
